What is NDHA

The North Dakota Hospital Association (NDHA) is a nonprofit membership organization, affiliated with the American Hospital Association, which provides leadership on healthcare issues. The Association provides a forum for the exchange of ideas, information research and methods of improving healthcare delivery.

Through discussion, advocacy, and exploration, the NDHA works to create an understanding of healthcare needs and healthcare delivery in North Dakota.
